Service Learning Pre-Service Reflection

In preparation of service, have students think about their service site, the population the site serves, the service they will perform and their expectations for the experience.

Pre-Service Reflection...

- ♦ Starts the learning process before the service learning experience even begins
- Engages students in thoughtful reflection from the beginning of the service learning experience
- Helps students become familiar with the site, the population the site serves and the service they will perform
- Documents students' initial thoughts, feelings and expectations
- Helps students compare their thoughts pre-service to their thoughts post-service
- Helps students draw conclusions from their service experience

Pre-Service Reflections can occur through in-class discussions, journal entries, and/or short papers. Groups of students visiting similar sites can be grouped together for inclass discussions. The combination of an in-class discussion and a writing activity typically yields stronger reflections.
