## PART I: CHAIR'S REVIEW OF 2012

A few changes in department administration took place in fall 2012, as the following table indicates.

Attrition in the number of Philosophy faculty occurred in 2012 through retirement, death, and sabbaticals. Ed Henderson, Professor of Philosophy, retired from LSU on May 18, 2012 and was named Professor Emeritus and Department Chair Emeritus. He served at LSU for over 20 years at the rank of Professor and 23 years as Department Chair. Associate Professor Ian Crystal, specializing in Ancient Philosophy, passed away on November 14, 2012. Three members of the Philosophy faculty took sabbaticals: Husain Sarkar and Greg Schufreider in the spring, and Mary Sirridge in the fall.

The department conducted two tenure reviews and one third-year review. Ed Song, assistant professor of Philosophy, underwent tenure review in spring 2012. He received tenure and promotion to associate professor, effective January 2013. Michael Pasquier, assistant professor in Religious Studies, underwent early tenure review in fall 2012. He received tenure and promotion to associate professor, effective August 19, 2013. Stephen Finley, assistant professor in Religious Studies and AAAS, underwent his third-year review in spring 2012. He was reappointed and granted a teaching release for fall 2012.

Several changes among instructors and adjuncts occurred in 2012. Michael Gueno, instructor in Religious Studies, accepted a tenure-track position at the University of Wisconsin at Whitewater on May 7, 2012. Molly Reed, ABD from Florida State University, took over this instructor position, effective August 2012. Michael Rolfsen, a physician at Baton Rouge Clinic with an M.A. in bioethics, began teaching PHIL 2025 (Bioethics) as an adjunct in Philosophy in spring 2012. Gary Pettigrew, a psychologist in Baton Rouge who long taught REL 3203 (Religion and Parapsychology) as an adjunct, retired from teaching at the end of the fall semester. Stephen Finley has taken over that course.

A significant improvement in the public face of the department occurred in August with the launch of a new website: <a href="http://uiswcmsweb.prod.lsu.edu/hss/prs/index.html">http://uiswcmsweb.prod.lsu.edu/hss/prs/index.html</a>. Sydney Nakashima, the College's webmaster, helped to create the site using the program "Rhythmyx."

Refurbishment of faculty offices continued in 2012. Raffoul, Isbell, Roland, and Meshal moved to renovated offices on the first floor of Coates. Arai, Pasquier, Finley, and Song moved from the third-floor attic to renovated offices on the first or second floor.

The 2012 Student Learning Outcomes Reports for every departmental degree program were submitted on TaskStream by October 15, 2012.

The least successful endeavor in 2012 was the search to fill a position in feminist philosophy, since the search ended without a hire and led to increased tensions within the Philosophy faculty. Otherwise the department had a reasonably productive year. Significant accomplishments, activities, and developments in 2012 are itemized in the following lists.

#### **PART II: STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE**

#### Mission Statement

The mission of the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies is 1) to preserve and effectively transmit to undergraduate and graduate students knowledge about the philosophies and religions that have shaped and continue to shape the history and cultures of the world; 2) to develop in our students the ability to read, to understand, and to think critically and synthetically; 3) to generate new knowledge and deeper understanding of philosophical and religious matters as a contribution to knowledge in these disciplines; and 4) to make professional expertise in philosophy and religious studies available to meet the needs of the larger community in appropriate ways.

#### **Vision Statement**

The vision of the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies is to be a community of teacher-scholars of the highest caliber who work together effectively to accomplish the mission of the department.

#### **Department Goals**

**Goal 1**: to increase the department's publication rate from an average of 1.31 articles<sup>1</sup> per faculty member per year over a five-year period (2006-2010) to an average of 1.5 articles per faculty member per year over a five-year period (2011-2015).

The department publication rate in 2012 exceeded the rate for 2006-2010 and the rate for 2011. The average rate for the two-year period 2011-12 is 1.66, which exceeds the goal of 1.5 for the five-year period 2011-15.

**Goal 2**: to increase the number of research grants obtained, specifically to increase the number of NEH (or NEA) research grants from one over a five-year period (2006-2010) to at least two over the next five-year period (2011-15).

Michael Pasquier received an NEH Summer Institute fellowship for 2012. He also received an NEA Art Works Design Grant with collaborators Dykema and Carney for 2012-13. At this point Goal 2 of the department's five-year strategic plan has been accomplished.

**Goal 3**: To increase the number of students graduating with a major in philosophy or religious studies from an average of 33 per year over a five-year period (2006-2010) to an average of 40 per year over the next five-year period (2011-15).

The number of majors graduating in 2010-11 was close to the average for the previous five years. The number dropped in 2011-12. This drop probably corresponds to the drop in number of majors in 2009-10. Because the number of majors has increased since then, over the next few years the number of majors graduating should also increase.

No new hires were made for 2010-11 or 2011-12. In 2012-13, Molly Reed was hired as an instructor in Religious Studies, bringing the number of women faculty to five. In fall of 2012, the Philosophy faculty conducted a search for a joint position with Women's and Gender Studies in feminist philosophy, but the search was unsuccessful. At this point, Goal 4 of the department's five-year strategic plan has been accomplished. However, possible hires over the remaining period of the plan will continue to take into account the gender imbalance within the Philosophy faculty.
